ABSTRAK

Penulis dalam penelitian ini membedah tentang sejenis aksi dalam bidang ekonomi yang dalam kajian Marxisme dikenal dengan istilah komodifikasi yang merupakan salah satu dampak dari sistim kapitalisme di Meksiko pada tahun 1930an. Tahun 1930 masih dipengaruhi oleh periode realisme dimana para penulis lebih cenderung terbuka dan blak-blakan dalam merefleksikan keadaan dan situasi yang sebenarnya ke dalam karya sastra, salah satunya di bidang ekonomi. Dalam hal ini, penulis lebih memfokuskan analisa dalam sudut pandang Marxisme dengan membahas komodifikasi (tindakan menilai suatu barang bahkan manusia berdasarkan nilai tukar yang dimilikinya) yang dilakukan oleh kaum borjuis terhadap kaum proletar (pekerja) yang terefleksi di dalam novel The Pearl karya John Steinbeck.

Penulis menggunakan metode kepustakaan dengan mengumpulkan informasi dan data dari berbagai buku dan jurnal. Analisa penulisan tesis ini menggunakan metode kualitatif yang diuraikan secara deskriptif. Dalam menganalisa dampak kapitalisme di dalam novel, penulis menggunakan pendekatan kritik sastra Marxisme

dengan memakai terminologi komodofikasi.

Akhirnya penulis menemukan adanya hal hal terselubung dibalik proses komodifikasi yang memberikan dampak negatif terhadap kaum proletar, dalam hal ini masyarakat Indian. Hal hal tersebut adalah determinasi ekonomi dan ideologi kapitalis. Kedua hal ini memacu tindakan komodifikasi dan menyebabkan adanya pemujaan terhadap komoditi secara berlebihan. Selain itu, kaum proletar sebagai kaum tertindas sebagaimana yang terefleksikan di dalam novel hanya bisa menyerah pada keaadaan ketidakadilan dalam masyarakat yang mereka alami dibawah kekuasaan kaum borjuis.

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 The Background of the Research

The existence of economic determinism in twentieth century America triggers further impacts in the society, like the development of capitalistic ideologies. Such an ideology influences Mexican social values, and therefore this matter results ideology which leads commodification (a condition by which all things in society (even people) regarded as commodity) and commodity fetishism (a worship to commodity which posses an exchange value as its soul). All these capitalistic aspects really corrupt the Mexican society, therefore, I conduct this research because all of these capitalistic aspects are really absurd or vague and hard to decipher. These matters are intricate problems actually, and this research is intended to reveal all those vague capitalistic aspects.

The Pearl by John Steinbeck is the novel that I choose in conducting this research. I choose this novel because it has various aspects of economic determinism, capitalistic ideology, and other capitalistic aspects that are very appropriate to analyze by means of Marxist Literary Approach. Therefore, this literary work is very appropriate for this research. The Pearl by John Steinbeck tells about the hard life of an Indian man named Kino with his little family. He, his wife and his little son live in

poverty until he finds a big pearl in the sea. He and his family put a big expectation toward the pearl. Unfortunately, the pearl just brings a trouble for him. Some characters as the representation of bourgeoisie class try to get the pearl from him.

Every research in social and human science is responsible to enlighten the society. The core benefit of this research is to meet this responsibility; to enlighten our society from the corrupt effects of capitalistic aspects, and of course, to enrich the world of literary criticism.

In conducting this research, I use one of Marxist's term which is commodification. The goal of commodification is to keep and even to raise your position in your society financially or socially, because commodification is the acts of relating to objects or persons in terms of their exchange value or sign-exchange value. In this novel, I see some aspects that covered behind commodification process, to uncover this problem, I conduct this research. Steinbeck as a realist writer, show clearly about how economic determinism was happen in early twentieth century Mexico. The economic determinism, build some ideologies which Marx regard as a 'false consciousness' in both Indian and Whites society. These capitalist system process (economic determinism and ideology) appearing commodification as a condition by which all things in society (even people) regarded as commodification that have exchange value and sign exchange value that reflected in John Steinbeck's The Pearl. Some persons who represent as bourgeoisie class do commodification in order to get a high status in society. Commodity fetishism is the estuary of those acts that reflect in proletariat class in the novel.

Furthermore, proletariat as the representation of working class, in this case is Indian, cannot do anything to against these capitalist systems. In this novel, they just can give up and cannot do anything; they do realize that they are always controlled by bourgeoisie. This is proven by Kino's failure in achieving his great future if he is selling the pearl.
