## ABSTRAK

Skripsi ini membahas tentang gambaran psikologis yang dialami oleh Frankie Addams sebagai tokoh utama dalam novel karya Carson McCullers, <u>The Member of The Wedding</u>. Masalah psikologi yang paling menonjol dalam diri Frankie adalah masalah kecemasan. Frankie Addams digambarkan mengalami berbagai kecemasan yang disebabkan oleh kondisi lingkungan yang tidak seimbang, tidak adanya perhatian dari keluarga dan penolakan dari teman-teman.

Dalam pengumpulan data penulis menggunakan metode studi kepustakaan dan untuk menganalisa permasalahan yang ditemukan, penulis menggunakan pendekatan objektif, didukung dengan teori psikologi sastra yang dikemukakan oleh Sigmund Freud mengenai teori kecemasan dan dilanjutkan dengan mekanisme pertahanan diri. Penelitian ini merupakan penelitian kualitatif karena menggunakan metode deskriptif sebagai metode penyajian data.

Dari penelitian ini, penulis menemukan bahwa pengaruh dari konflikkonflik psikologi yang dialami oleh Frankie menimbulkan kecemasan dalam dirinya. Kecemasan tersebut tidak berlangsung dalam jangka waktu yang lama karena Frankie menekan kecemasan tersebut dengan menggunakan mekanisme pertahanan diri sebagaimana yang dilakukan manusia pada umumnya. Frankie berhasil lepas dari kecemasannya diusia tiga belas tahun setelah dia diterima menjadi anggota atau bagian dari lingkungannya.

#### INTRODUCTION

# 1.1 Background of the Research

There are some of her works such as <u>The Heart is a Lonely Hunter</u> (1940), <u>The Member of the Wedding (1946)</u>, <u>The Ballad of the Sad Cafe (1951)</u>, and <u>Clock without Hands</u> (1967). Generally, the main characters in Carson McCullers' fiction are abnormal, and most of them are so fantastic. In this

research her third novel entitled <u>The Member of the Wedding</u> would be the subject to be analyzed. Since, as Brook says that, "<u>The Member of the Wedding</u> is her most popular novel. It was published in 1946. That story got a great success at that time, winning the Donadlson award, The New York Critics Circle award, and Winning Broadway Play" (1973: 2545). The psychology problem as the main issue of the novel becomes the specific object to be analyzed, especially toward the main character.

The Member of the Wedding is a psychological novel. The writer is interested in analyzing the psychological aspects because the writer sees that many problems emerge from people's psychology. Here, the writer will explain what type of human being sees from their psychology. Then, discussion will touch on id, ego and superego that faced by the main characters.
