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ABSTRAK

Penulis dalam penelitian ini membedah percampuran budaya atau hibriditi budaya hibrid dalam komunitas imigran India di Inggris dalam novel *The Buddha of Suburbia* karya Hanif Kureishi. Aspek-aspek kultural utama yang diungkap dalam penelitian ini terkait dengan masalah gaya hidup dan dampak hibriditi tersebut terhadap identitas nasional masyarakat India di Inggris.

Penulis menggunakan kajian poskolonial yaitu teori hibriditi dan mimikri dalam pendekatan mimetik. Penelitian ini menggunakan metode kualitatif dalam proses analisa data, dan menggunakan metode kajian pustaka dalam proses

pengumpulan data.

Hasil analisis menunjukkan bahwa kedatangan imigran India ke Inggris pada abad ke-19 memberi dampak pada lahirnya budaya baru di Inggris, yaitu budaya campuran antara budaya India dan Inggris. Hibriditi diawali dengan mimikri (meniru), yang mana imigran India melihat budaya baru (Western), kemudian menirunya dan menerapkannya tanpa meninggalkan budaya asli mereka. Hibriditi (percampuran budaya) yang terjadi di Inggris yang juga tergambar dalam novel, bisa dilihat dari gaya hidup dan pendidikan. Konsekuensi dari percampuran budaya antara Inggris dan India adalah terjadinya krisis identitas, atau kerancuan identitas seperti yang tampak jelas pada tokoh Karim dan Jamila terkait dengan gaya hidup dan pendidikan mereka. Krisis identitas tersebut menyebabkan Karim dan Jamila ragu akan identitas nasional mereka. Pada akhirnya Karim memutuskan untuk menerima budaya Inggris, menolak budaya atau adat istiadat India, akan tetapi ia tetap mempertahankan identitas nasionalnya sebagai orang India. Jamila memutuskan untuk kembali pada budaya aslinya, yaitu budaya India.

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 The Background of the Research

The colonization done by British Empire had rendered the gradual effects in ex-colonies. It did not only influence the developments of economic and politic, but simultaneously it resulted in emergence of a new kind of literature, that we call it then, Postcolonial literature. Postcolonial literature can be categorized as the result of the interaction between imperial culture and true complex colonial culture when the colonizer comes to the colonized country. Ashcroft, Griffith and Tiffin in their Book *The Empire Writes Back: Theory and Practice in Post-Colonial Literatures* states, "...the terms 'postcolonial literature' finally preferred over the others because it points the way towards a possible study of the effect of colonialism" (2002:23). It shows that postcolonial literature not only studies the literary work itself, but also gets any attention to the impact of colonialism.

As also supported by Porter in *Literary Theory: Research Training Module XI* that "post-colonialism attacks the same ideas where they have given rise to and justified Western imperialism" (1998:48). Then, postcolonial as a new term becomes very popular and is discussed in literary works in which it concerns on colonialism. Actually, some aspects of post colonialism look at the identities in colonized countries and the difficulties to find a national identity as the impact of colonization.

One of postcolonial study discussed about the issue of identity is "hybridity" that become popular discussion among researchers. We can learn that hybridity is a problem of mix-culture. Here, I conduct on research by using postcolonialism that the crucial focus is about hybridity. I am interested in conducting this research because I see there is a solid problem that occurs after the colonization, particularly in culture. It is only showing two cultures that becomes one, but above all the changing of culture can influence people identity.
